1	<p>Welcome and Attendee Sign-In</p> <p>Head Coach Paul Wallace noted Participants and distributed 2010 REP Manager's Handbooks. If a Team was not represented, the Handbook is available in the RIM Office.</p>
2	<p>Club Coaches</p> <p>Marc LaCoste met with Club Coaches, new job descriptions have been detailed, and contracts are to be finalized in approximately 1 week.</p> <p>Club Coach Willie Smith provided an overview of new program. The purpose is to organize sessions of vital fundamentals for Players out of HL, to prepare them to progress to REP, then proceed to more integrated skills for 12 year olds. The program is deliberately starting with younger age groups to build a quality base. Friday February 12 7:30-9 PM, whole field at RIM until the end of March, U10-11-12-13 Boys. Structure: Week 1: 6 Boys Players per age group do same skills and then in a game situation. Following Week repeat with Girls. Coaches are welcome and encouraged to observe sessions and to participate at the end, as it is vital that all understand and execute. To date, positive feedback and very good attendance are noted. Marc LaCoste will send out detailed schedule.</p>

<p>3</p>	<p>L6 Advanced Recreational (former Tournament Teams)</p> <p>Overview Rick Flanagan described the <u>L6 Advanced Recreational</u> initiative for Players to play in Intercity as being recreational as opposed to competitive, and takes the place of former tournament Teams. The program is to appeal to higher skilled HL Players who do not yet fit in to REP. In the past, Tournament Teams were created when a Coach provided additional time per week and took the teams to tournaments from May to September once HL season was finished. These Players no longer want to go back to HL, do want to stay together, do want to play more competitively than HL from May to Sept, and do not play REP for a variety of reasons (amount of travel, level of commitment, etc).</p> <p>Interest Coaching applications are due by February 15th. To date, 23 Players at all age groups have expressed interest.</p> <p>Player Selection The Players become carded - REP Teams short of numbers can pull some of these players. Player selection would begin after REP Teams have been picked, with existing L6 C Teams. Following Conestoga Mall Mass Registration, a list of Players can serve as a reference from which Coaches may contact Players.</p> <p>Note To be considered is the risk of diluting the pool of resources (fields, Coaches).</p> <p>Pyramid of Play Brian Jewett, BoD Governing Bodies, explains that final Teams must be in leagues by March 15, and provided an overview of the Pyramid of Play (2010 REP Manager's Handbook, p. 13). L4 divisions proposed by WOYSL were not approved so there are now less divisions to promote teams into which affects the pyramid. League challenges are discussed, including current SWRSL situation. An eventual increase in the number of Teams will help populate levels over time, and the pyramid of play will continue to evolve.</p> <p>L6 has no forced promotion. Competitive level begins in L5 and Players are carded differently and Teams advance differently. Sometimes there are 2 or 3 Teams from a club in same league, with rules of re-delegation applying.</p> <p>U13 Boys C Last year, the Team was League Champion, and will be prevented from moving up to L5. The league placement of U13 Boys C will be reviewed.</p> <p>U11 Girls B L5 needs 5 teams at U11 to run a division. There is a question of having a B Team play up with all A teams. Discussion re U11 B placement continues and may be end of February before placement decision is final.</p>
<p>4</p>	<p>2010 REP Manager's Handbook</p> <p>Office Staff and RC Members Sheila Wallace and Jocelyn Mennill have updated the Handbook. Sign out 1 binder per Team. The request to post handbook online will be reviewed by the RC.</p>

Office Updates

Registration Program There are new financial assistance adjustments for families looking for support of the registration program. The form will be posted on the club website. Last year, 51 families had applied.

Goal Keeper Voucher 1 voucher per Team for the Sports Link Inc was distributed and the procedure described. Should a Player prefer to go elsewhere, there would not be financial reimbursement. Goal Keepers from same team share the amount of the voucher.

Fundraising All are reminded to submit 2010 REP Manager's Handbook Appendix 4 for club approval of a fundraising event in order to have proper insurance.

Insurance OSA only covers training. Notify Office of time and location of the game, and the game, and tournaments.

Numbers on Jerseys Refer to 2010 REP Manager's Handbook, p. 26. Numbers 1-19 are required for back of Player shirt. If some changes want to change, there is no extra cost. No names on the back as per club policy.

St David's The field booking from end of March to week 1 May is not confirmed. The Wilfrid Laurier soccer field may be booked if no St David's confirmation is forthcoming by week's end. To offset the higher Laurier fee, field could be shared by Teams.

RIM Park Fields WMSC had booked as of the beginning June, however field completion may take longer. Bechtel will transition in. Bechtel 5 and 6 are gone for next year. 5 Pillars fields, which were a gift for the last 10 years, are no longer available at Pillars as of last week due to an expansion. Some other fields are being discussed. Coaches still looking for additional field time are asked to contact the Office. As HL registration is taking place, the Office is very busy.

Police Checks Anyone who sits on the bench (Coach, Assistant Coach, Manager) must have a police check. Refer to 2010 REP Manager's Handbook, p. 16.

Outstanding B Rosters Carding procedure Office needs to take a Player out of HL and put in REP. Outstanding teams are identified and asked to submit their rosters without further delay.

Ontario Cup The Ontario Cup registration fees and referee details are on pages 33-34 of the 2010 REP Manager's Handbook. Coaches and Managers will be notified if there are any changes.

Allocation of Field Time Field time will be detailed as soon as possible.
